# COMPLAINT

Complainant, by himself, respectfully states:

### NATURE OF COMPLAINT

This is a verified complaint for the impeachment of respondent Hon. Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo, incumbent President of the Republic of the Philippines, upon grounds mentioned below. This complaint is filed pursuant to the provisions of Article XI (Accountability of Public Officers), Sections 2 and 3 of the Philippine Constitution.

#### THE PARTIES

Complainant is a Filipino citizen, of legal age, and with business address at Unit 1B 2/F Cacho Gonzales Building, 101 Aguirre Street, Legaspi Village, Makati City where he may be served with the processes of this Honorable Body; while Respondent is the incumbent President of the Republic of the Philippines and may be served with summons and other processes of this august body at the Office of the President, Malacanang, Manila.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

On June 30, 2004, Respondent took her oath of office as the 14<sup>th</sup>
 President of the Republic of the Philippines, stating:

"I do solemnly swear that I will faithfully and conscientiously fulfil my duties as President of the Philippines, preserve and defend its Constitution, execute its laws, do justice to every man, and consecrate myself to the service of the Nation. So help me God."

- Thereafter, or on July 1, 2004, she assumed office and took on the duties and responsibilities as the President of the Republic.
- 3. During her incumbency as President of the Republic, the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Communications, Sec. Leandro Mendoza, on April 21, 2007 entered into an agreement with the ZTE for the latter to provide equipments, construct and install the same for the National Broadband Network Project under terms and conditions apparently disadvantageous to the Filipino people.
- 4. It appears that entering into such contract was actually dictated by the illegal and corrupt machinations undertaken by high government officials, including but not limited to Chairman Benjamin Abalos of the Commission on Elections (COMELEC), House Speaker Jose De Venecia, Jr. and the Speaker's son, Jose De Venecia III. In fact, in an affidavit executed by Jose De Venecia III, he admits that a breakfast meeting was organized by House Speaker Jose De Venecia to allow the two proponents of the National Broadbank Network Project, ZTE and AHI, to consolidate their proposals and corner the broadband project.

Attached herewith and made an integral part hereof as Annex "A" is a photocopy of the said affidavit.

5. That these corrupt and illegal negotiations were being undertaken was not unknown to the Respondent. In fact, in his testimony before the Senate, Jose De Venecia III claimed under oath that his father, Speaker Jose De Venecia, told him that the Respondent President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo, Speaker Jose De Venecia, Jr. and COMELEC Chairman Benjamin Abalos discussed the respective proposals of AHI and ZTE during a golf game in China.1

6. Worse, Secretary Romulo Neri, in his September 26, 2007 testimony before the Senate, admitted under oath that he was offered a P200M bribe by COMELEC Chairman Abalos, and that he reported the matter to the Respondent President. Despite being told of the bribe offer, the Respondent did nothing.

#### GROUNDS

7. On the basis of the foregoing facts that now form part of the official records of the Senate, there is ground to assert that:

## RESPONDENT BETRAYED THE PUBLIC TRUST

A. The Respondent betrayed the public trust when she connived with COMELEC Chairman Benjamin Abalos and House Speaker Jose De Venecia, Jr. to manipulate the proposals for a national broadband network to pave the way for an overpriced and anomalous contract.

B. The Respondent betrayed the public trust when she had the project implemented by the Department of Transportation and Communications

### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, premised considered, it is respectfully prayed that after evaluation, this Complaint be given due course.
