EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article I of the 1987 Constitution declares that the Philippines is an archipelagic state and defines our national territory as comprising "the Philippine archipelago, with all the islands and waters embraced therein, and all other territories over which the Philippines has sovereignty or jurisdiction..." However, the said Constitution failed to delineate the boundaries of the Philippine archipelago.

The Kalayaan Island Group (KIG) consisting of about seventy-five islands, cave, shoals, and bank reefs with a total area of 68,807.85 nautical square miles, is considered as an integral part of the Philippines by historic right and legal title. Thus, the late President Marcos declared in 1978 through Presidential Decree No. 1596 that the Kalayaan Island Group (KIG) is part of the continental margin of the Philippine archipelago. The said declaration together with an accompanying technical description of the area was registered with the United Nations Secretariat on June 18, 1980. Likewise, the Kalayaan Island Group is considered an integral part of the Philippine archipelago by occupation and exercises of jurisdiction because Filipino citizens have peacefully established their domicile on the islands and is part of the political subdivision of the province of Palawan.

The United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), which entered into force on November 14, 1994, recognized in Article 46 thereof that "an archipelagic state is a group of islands including parts of islands, interconnecting waters and other natural features which are so closely interrelated that such islands, waters and other natural features form an intrinsic geographical, economic and political entity, or which historically have been regarded as such". Likewise, under the UNCLOS, an archipelagic state is allowed to draw straight baselines joining the outermost points of the outer islands and drying reefs.

In 1961, Republic Act 3046, as amended by Republic Act No. 5446 in 1968, was enacted to establish the Philippine Baselines Law. Since it was enacted long before the effectivity of the UNCLOS and the recognition of the archipelagic doctrine, the Kalayaan Island group was necessarily not yet

included. P. D. No. 1596 likewise failed to include and integrate the boundaries of the Kalayaan Island Group with those provided in R. A. No. 3046 as amended by R. A. No. 5446.

This representation believes that to avert any future unnecessary dispute with foreign states, an adaptation in toto of House Bill No. 1202 filed by Rep. Antonio Cuenco is essential. It seeks to amend R. A. No. 3046 as amended by R. A. No. 5446 by drawing straight baselines on the outermost points of Scarborough Shoal and joining them with the baselines defined under R. A. No. 3046, as amended, as well as to include the KIG as regime of islands, with some amendments to conform with the criteria set under Article 47 of the Convention on the Law of the Sea.

The establishment of new baseline laws of the Philippines is necessary as it shall serve as basis from which to draw the 12 mile territorial sea, the 24 mile contiguous zone and the 200 mile Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) as provided under the UNCLOS. Likewise, the same shall also serve as the official notification to all States on the extent of the limits of the maritime zone of the Philippine archipelago and thus avert any unnecessary dispute with vessels of foreign states entering Philippine maritime territory without our permission.

In view of the foregoing reasons, the immediate enactment of this bill is urgently sought.

AN ACT

DEFINING THE ARCHIPELAGIC BASELINES OF THE PHILIPPINE ARCHIPELAGO, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 3046, AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 5446.

Be it enacted by the House of Representatives and the Senate of the Philippines in Congress assembled.

Section 1. **Short Title.** This act shall be known as the "Archipelagic Baselines Law of the Philippines".

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Sec. 2. **Declaration of Policy.** The Philippines is an archipelagic state and its national territory comprises the Philippine archipelago, with all the islands and waters embraced therein, and all other territories over which the Philippines has sovereignty or jurisdiction, consisting of its terrestrial, fluvial, and aerial domains, including its territorial sea, the seabed, the subsoil, the insular shelves, and other submarine areas. The waters around, between, and connecting the islands of the archipelago, regardless of their breadth and dimensions, form part of the internal waters of the Philippines.

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Sec. 3. **Archipelagic Baselines.** The geographical coordinates of the location basepoints of the archipelagic baselines of the Philippines are hereby defined and prescribed as follows:

Sec. 5. Without Prejudice Clause. The delineation of baselines as provided in this Act shall be without prejudice to any claims to any contested portions of the national territory or maritime zones and jurisdictions of the Philippines, in accordance with international law and under appropriate international dispute resolution mechanisms.

Sec. 6. **Vested Rights.** The delineation of baselines as provided in this Act shall be without prejudice to vested rights existing or being claimed by virtue of Republic Act No. 7160 (otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, as Amended) and other laws which give rise to local government allotments and shares in the income generated from natural resources within the national territory as delineated prior to this Act.

Sec. 7. Registration with the United Nations. This Act, together with the geographic coordinates and the charts and maps indicating the aforesaid baselines, shall be deposited and registered with the Secretary General of the United Nations.

Sec. 8. **Issuance of Appropriate Charts and Maps.** The National Mapping and Resource Information Authority (NAMRIA) shall forthwith produce and publish charts and maps of the appropriate scale clearly representing the delineation of basepoints and baselines as set forth in this Act.

Sec. 9. **Appropriations.** The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be provided in a supplemental budget or included in the General Appropriations Act of the Year of its enactment into law.

Sec. 10. Repealing Clause. Republic Act No. 3046 as amended by Republic Act No. 5446 and all other laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and

issuances inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

Sec. 11. **Separability Clause.** If any portion or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other portions or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Sec. 12. **Effectivity Clause**. This Act shall take effect fifteen days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in any two newspapers of general circulation in the Philippines.
